FOOD & GARDEN ORGANICS OR 'FOGO' BIN

Maroon bins with green lids are replacing the maroon food and garden bins as they get damaged or wear out.

Check the packaging before putting an item in the recycling bin.



All compostable or biodegradable packaging needs to go in the rubbish bin. Our composting contractor cannot accept any bags or packaging due to the time it takes to break down. This material affects the quality of the finished compost sent to farmers.

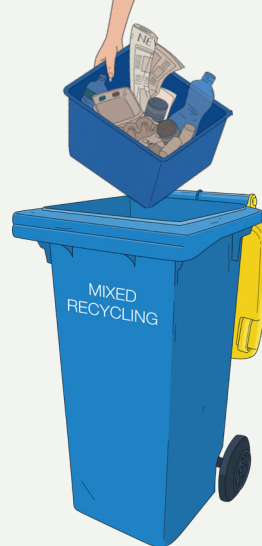


DIRT, SOIL, LOGS, TIMBER, ASH OR PLANT POTS

MIXED RECYCLING BIN

Remove all left over food. All lids to be removed first. Items to be empty, clean, dry and loose (not in bags) before binning.

Only hard plastics with numbers 1-5 can be recycled. Plastics with numbers 6-7 go into the rubbish bin.



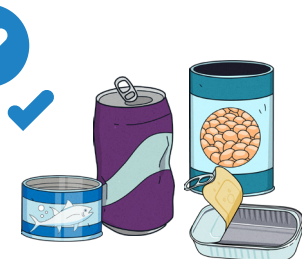

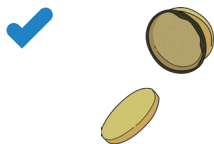
Once your purple-lidded glass bin arrives, glass bottles and jars must go into your new bin instead of the yellow-lidded mixed recycling bin.

Plastics with numbers 6-7 go in your general waste bin. Clean hard plastics with numbers 1-5 can go in your yellow-lidded mixed recycling bin.



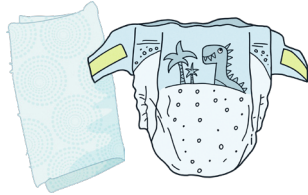

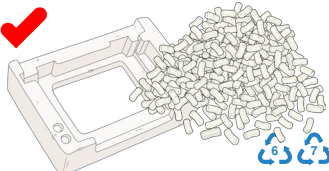

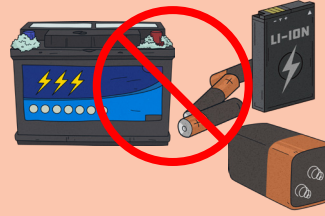

ILLEGAL DUMPING – HOW IT HURTS US

Environmental hurt

- Pollutes waterways, soil and habitats
- Attracts pests and vermin
- Creates fire hazards

Community hurt

- Makes streets unsafe and messy
- Lowers neighbourhood pride
- Encourages more dumping

Financial hurt

- Council spends significant funds removing dumped waste

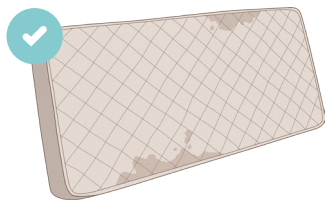

TOP TIPS

- ✓ Collection must not be over 3 cubic metres (3m long x 1m high x 1m wide). No single item can be longer than 1.5m, nothing over 30kg.
- ✓ Place out the Sunday evening before your booked collection date
- ✓ Take a photo of your pile once it is out to help identify illegal dumping
- ✓ Please notify Council immediately if someone dumps any waste on your pile before it is collected
- ✓ Remove batteries from any appliances or electronic items
- ✗ No rubbish in plastic bags
- ✗ No building, construction or renovation materials
- ✗ No asbestos or cement sheeting
- ✗ No unwrapped or broken glass
- ✗ No batteries



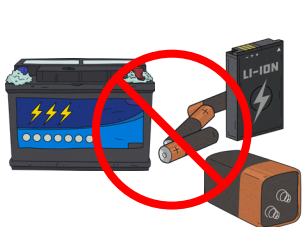

E-WASTE

To help protect our environment and recover the material, the Victorian Government has banned all e-waste from landfill. That means e-waste can't go in any household bin.

Help recycle e-waste so it can be reused to make new technology in the future.



HOUSEHOLD TOOLS AND BATTERIES INCLUDING CAR BATTERIES (CANNOT BE INCLUDED IN HARD WASTE COLLECTION)



WHITE GOODS SUCH AS FRIDGES, FREEZERS, WASHING MACHINES AND DRYERS



TELEVISIONS, COMPUTERS, LAPTOPS, MOBILE PHONES, PRINTERS, CAMERAS AND REMOTE CONTROLS



LIGHTS



HOME APPLIANCES SUCH AS COFFEE MACHINES, MICROWAVES, HAIR DRYERS, TOASTERS AND KETTLES

TOP TIPS

- ✓ Thoughtfully recycle of any item with a plug, battery or power cord that's no longer working or wanted
- ✓ Take e-waste to a drop off point or add to your hard waste collection (no batteries)
- ✗ No e-waste in recycling or rubbish bins

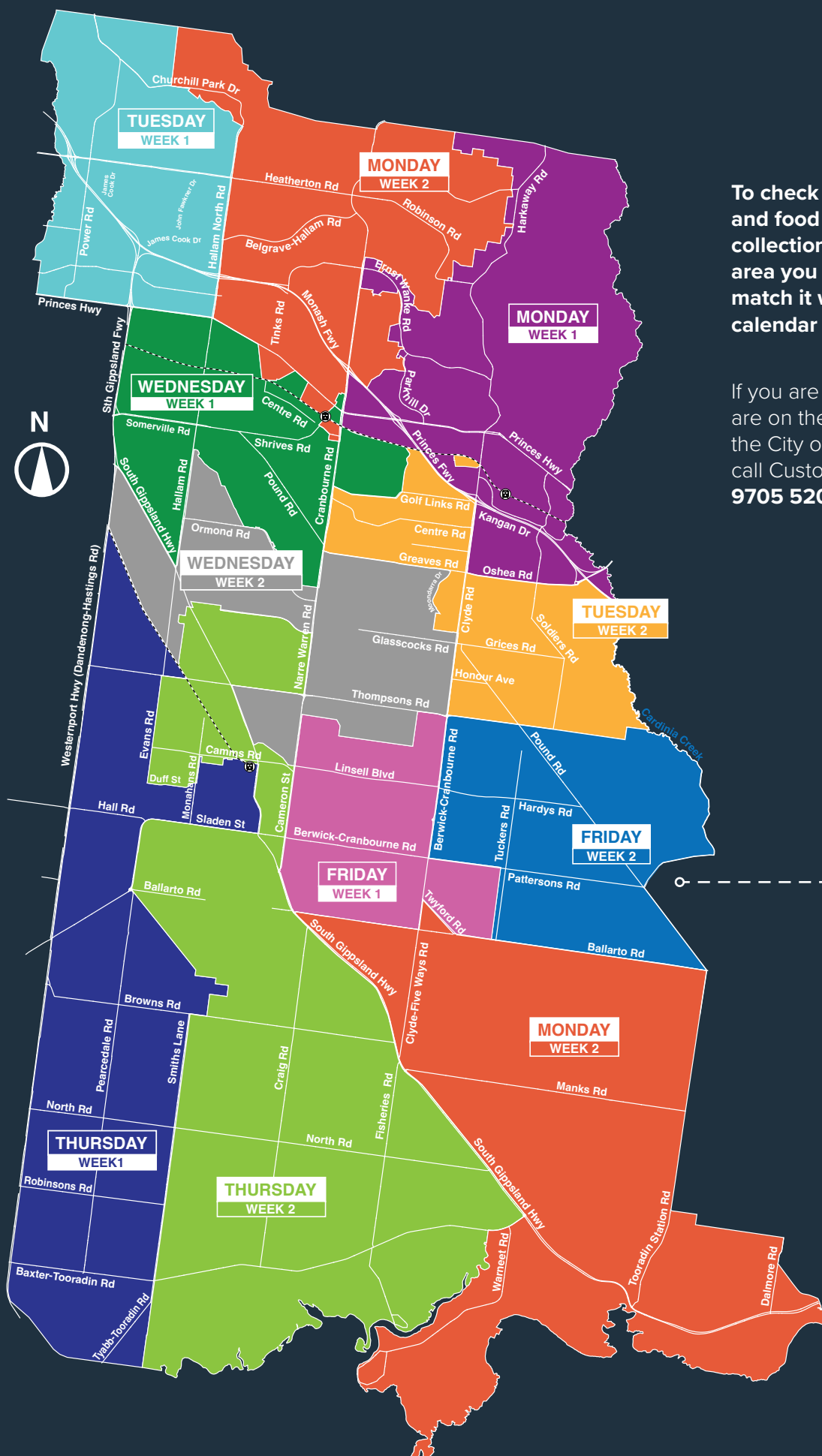


BIN IT RIGHT!

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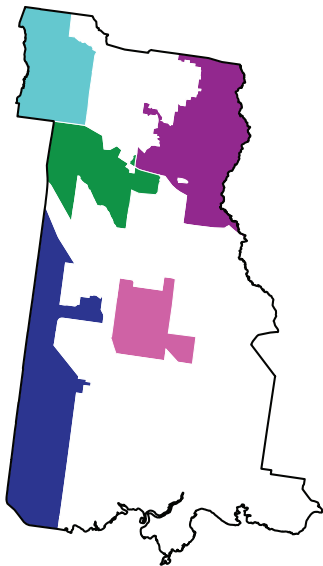

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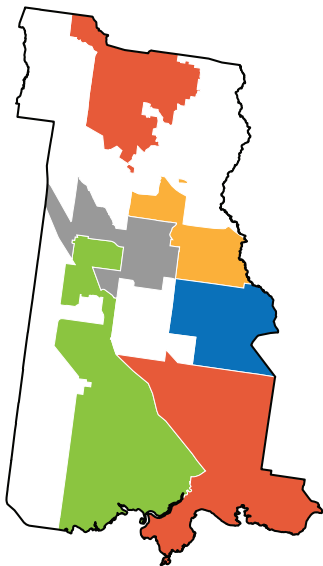

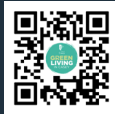
